


What is ComCare?

ComCare provides social assistance for low-income individuals and families. ComCare programmes are funded by the Community Care Endowment Fund (ComCare Fund).

The ComCare Fund was established in 2005. It provides sustainable funding for social assistance programmes for low-income Singaporeans. The ComCare Fund stands at \$1.5 billion today.

How can ComCare help?



How can ComCare help?

ComCare provides:

Short-to-medium term Assistance

For needy individuals who may be:

- · Jobless or earning a low income
- · Temporarily unable to work

Long-term Assistance

For needy individuals who are non-work capable, including those who:

- Are permanently unable to work due to old age, illness or disability; and
- · Have little or no family support

Assistance for Children

For children from needy families, who need assistance with:

- Child care fees (children below 7 years old)
- Kindergarten fees (children between 3-6 years old)
- Student care fees (children aged between 7-14 years old)

Who may qualify?

A person may qualify for short-to-medium term assistance if he/she:

- Has a household income of less than \$1,700 per month.
- Has per capita income of less than \$550.
- Is looking for work or temporarily unable to work.

(Note: As this is only a rough guide, please refer your client to the nearest Community Development Council for a more detailed assessment.) A person may qualify for long-term assistance if he/she:

- Is permanently unable to work due to old age, illness or disability and his family is unable to support him.
- Has little or no income, savings or assets to rely on for his daily needs.

A family with young children may qualify for assistance if:

- The preschool child is below 7 years of age or the schoolgoing child is between 7-14 years of age.
- The household income is less than \$3,500 per month.
- The per capita income is less than \$875.

Where to apply for ComCare assistance?

For kindergarten, child care and student care subsidies, applications should be made at the child's licensed Child Care Centre, eligible Kindergarten or registered Student Care Centre.

Applications for other ComCare assistance can be made at the Community Development Councils (CDCs).

What to bring to the CDCs?

The CDC officer will speak with the applicant to understand why he/she needs help and the nature of help needed. The applicant should bring the following documents to the CDC to facilitate the assessment:

- √ Identity card
- ✓ Identity card(s) of family member(s) within the same household, if applicable
- ✓ Birth certificate(s) of children below 15 years old, if applicable
- ✓ Marriage or divorce certificate
- ✓ Latest payslip(s)
- ✓ CPF statement of account(s)

- ✓ Bank account passbook(s)
- ✓ Medical appointment card(s), if applicable
- ✓ Town Council Book
- ✓ HDB Book (For rental flats)
- ✓ Latest Power Supply bill
- ✓ Documents on assistance received from other organisation(s), if applicable
